Page 1 of 5 Important Tourist Visa Conditions

Information Prior to Travelling to Taiwan Current DFAT Travel Advice

Australian ordinary passport holders who do not have a criminal record do not usually require a visa to enter Taiwan for a period of up to 30 days for tourist purposes (up to 90 days until December 31, 2017). Passports are recommended to be valid for six months beyond the period of intended stay. Travellers should also be able to show documentation confirming their ability to financially maintain themselves during their stay, as well as tickets and entry documents for their next or onward destination.

Additional conditions apply to minors and those who hold dual Australian/Taiwanese nationality. Travellers are recommended to contact a Taiwanese mission on the details below for further information and to ensure their specific circumstances make them eligible to enter Taiwan without a visa.

This advice is current for Mon, 5th November 2018.

<u>Exercise normal safety precautions</u> in Taiwan. Use common sense. Look out for suspicious behaviour. You'll be screened for high body temperature on arrival. Depending on results, you may need to do further medical tests. See <u>Entry and exit</u>.

Typhoon season is May to November when flooding and mudslides are common. Taiwan also has earthquakes. Monitor weather forecasts and plan accordingly. Take official warnings seriously and follow the instructions of local officials. See <u>Natural disasters</u>.

Vaccination against Hepatitis A is recommended for travellers to Taiwan. Vaccination against Typhoid should also be considered, particularly if travelling to areas with poor sanitation and hygiene. Persons staying in Taiwan for extended periods or frequent travellers should consider immunisation against Hepatitis B and Rabies (especially if working with animals). As Dengue Fever occurs in Taiwan travellers may require insect avoidance measures depending on their itinerary.

Regardless of destination, all travellers should be up-to-date with their routine "background" vaccinations, including for Tetanus and Diphtheria (with a booster within the last 10 years), Whooping Cough, Polio (with a booster in adult life), Measles, Mumps and Rubella (two combination vaccinations through life), Chicken Pox and a recent annual Influenza vaccination.

Please consult a medical practitioner or contact The Travel Doctor for your specific risk to these preventable diseases and the appropriate avoidance measures. Australians travelling to Taiwan should ensure that they have adequate travel insurance to cover the length of their stay. Medications that are legal in Australia may be illegal in other countries. Duty Free allowance when entering Taiwan: Alcohol: Up to 1 litre of liquor. Tobacco: 200 cigarettes or 25 cigars or 1lb of tobacco. Other Goods: Up to TWD 20,000.

Duty Free allowance when entering Australia: Alcohol: 2.25 litres. Tobacco: 25 cigarettes plus one open packet of cigarettes. Other Tax Free Goods: Up to AUD\$900 (\$450 for minors).



All rates were correct at a point in time on Monday, 05 Nov 2018. The "Interbank Rate" does not take into account any exchange fees, while the "Buy Rate" adds 11% to the exchange rate to simulate a typical margin paid when buying TWD notes in Australia. These rates have been rounded and should not be used when calculating transactions of large value.

Information and Cheat Sheet Purchasing Power Parity

The following is a purchasing-power comparison of the New Taiwan Dollar and the Australian Dollar, using the Big Mac as a common good. While it does not present a faultless comparison, it is a useful indicator of the purchasing power of each currency.

Big Mac Australia: \$5.95 (AUD) = 131 New Taiwan Dollars Big Mac Taiwan: NT\$69 (TWD) = 3.13 Australian Dollars

A Big Mac in Taiwan is therefore 47% less expensive than in Australia.

This comparison is based on 2018 prices using current exchange rates. Prices may not include variations by locality or local taxes.

The legal currency of Taiwan is the New Taiwan Dollar, which is abbreviated using the symbol "NT\$" and has the currency code "TWD". The NT\$ does have a subunit, but it is too small in value to be used in day to day transactions. The following units of currency are the most common however other units are also in circulation. Pictures are not to scale. As it is illegal in many countries to print copies of bank notes, travellers are advised not to take the below images with them when travelling.


