Page 1 of 5 Important Information Current DFAT Travel Advice

This advice is current for Mon, 5th November 2018.

<u>Exercise a high degree of caution</u> in Belgium due to the high threat of terrorist attack. Terrorists may be planning further attacks in Belgium. An attack could occur at any time. Exercise particular caution around locations known to be possible terrorist targets. See <u>Safety and security</u>. In June 2017, there was a failed terrorist attack at Brussels central train station. In March 2016, terrorist attacks at Brussels National Airport and at Maalbeek metro station killed 32 people and injured more than 300. See <u>Safety and security</u>. There are increased security checks at airports and train stations.

Always carry your passport with you when entering or leaving Belgium. Be alert to crime in Belgium, particularly in Brussels, Antwerp and other urban areas. Theft, muggings, bag snatching and pickpocketing are common in Brussels, particularly around major train stations, on trains and in the metro. More serious robberies and assaults also occur. Pickpockets operate on intercity and international trains. Pay close attention to valuables and your passport on public transport. See <u>Safety and security</u>.

Vaccinations and Health Precautions

Prior to Travelling to Belgium Passport and Tourist Visa Conditions

Belgium forms part of the Schengen Area. Australian passport holders are usually allowed to enter the Schengen Area for Tourism or Business purposes for up to 90 days in any 180 day period without a visa. The countries which make up the Schengen Area are Austria, Belgium, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden and Switzerland.

Travellers to the Schengen Area are recommended to ensure their passport is valid for at least six months beyond their intended stay. Travellers are also recommended to be able to provide documentation confirming their ability to financially maintain themselves during their stay as well as tickets and entry documents for their onward destination. For further information and to confirm that your specific circumstances make you eligible to travel to the Schengen area without a visa, please contact a Belgian mission on the details below.

Frequent or long stay travellers to Belgium should consider vaccination against hepatitis B. Regardless of destination, all travellers should be up-to-date with their routine "background" vaccinations, including a recent annual Influenza vaccination. Please consult a medical practitioner or contact The Travel Doctor for your specific risk to these preventable diseases and the appropriate avoidance measures.

Australians in Belgium are entitled to subsidised health care as part of the Reciprocal Health Care Agreement (RHCA) between the two countries. To take advantage of this program, travellers need to pay for the treatment or service they receive and take their receipt and Medicare card to any Belgium health insurance fund for reimbursement. For further information regarding the RHCA, please go to <u>www.humanservices.gov.au</u>. This agreement does not replace the need for travellers to take out travel insurance to cover the length of their stay. Medications that are legal in Australia may be illegal in other countries. Time Differences between Belgium and Australia

Belgium is Greenwich Mean Time +1 hour (+2 during daylight saving). The applicable time zone is Central European Time (CET) or Central European Summer Time (CEST). Daylight saving is observed from the last Sunday in March to the last Sunday in October.

Page 3 of 5 General Destination Information for Belgium Duty Free Allowances for Belgium and Australia

Duty Free limits when entering Belgium from a non EU state: Alcohol: 1 L spirits (>22% alc vol) or 2 L other beverages; as well as 4 L of still wine and 16 L of beer.

Tobacco: 200 cigarettes or 50 cigars or 250g of tobacco.

Other Goods: Up to a value of €430 for air and sea travellers, €300 for others and €150 for those under 15 years. Duty Free limits when entering Australia:

Alcohol: 2.25 litres of alcoholic beverages.

Tobacco:25 cigarettes plus one open packet of cigarettes.Other Goods:Up to \$900 (\$450 for minors).

Minors may not claim alcohol or tobacco products (min age limits is 17 yrs). Further restrictions apply when entering/exiting Belgium, Europe and Australia. Travellers are encouraged to familiarise themselves with these restrictions before crossing the borders of either country. 



Currency Information a n d Cheat Sheet Purchasing Power Parity

The following is a purchasing-power comparison of the Euro in Belgium and the Australian Dollar, using the Big Mac as a common good. While this is not a faultless comparison, it is a useful indicator of the purchasing-power of the two currencies.

3.76 Euro Big Mac Australia: \$5.95 (AUD) = 6.49 Australian Dollars Big Mac Belgium: €4.10 (EUR) =

A Big Mac in Belgium is therefore 9% more expensive than in Australia.

This comparison is based on 2018 prices using current exchange rates. Prices may not include variations by locality or local taxes.
