Page 1 of 5 Important Information Prior to Travelling to Norway

Passport and Tourist Visa Conditions

Norway forms part of the Schengen Area. Australian passport holders are usually allowed to enter the Schengen Area for Tourism or Business purposes for up to 90 days in any 180 day period without a visa. The countries which make up the Schengen Area are Austria, Belgium, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden and Switzerland.

Travellers to the Schengen Area are recommended to ensure their passport is valid for at least six months beyond their intended stay. Travellers are also recommended to be able to provide documentation confirming their ability to financially maintain themselves during their stay, travel insurance covering the period of stay in the Schengen Area as well as tickets and entry documents for their onward destination. Vaccinations and Health Precautions

Vaccination against Hepatitis B should be considered for travellers to Norway if they are frequent travellers or intending on a long stay. Tick-borne encephalitis is present throughout many areas in Europe, predominately in forested regions. Whilst no vaccine is available in Australia, travellers visiting risk areas and planning outdoor activities during summer might consider vaccination once in Europe. Regardless of destination, all travellers should be up-to-date with their routine "background" vaccinations, including for Tetanus and Diphtheria (with a booster within the last 10 years), Whooping Cough, Polio (with a booster in adult life), Measles, Mumps and Rubella (two combination vaccinations through life), Chicken Pox and a recent annual Influenza vaccination.

Australians in Norway are entitled to subsidised essential medical treatment as part of the Reciprocal Health Care Agreement (RHCA) between the two countries. To take advantage of this program, travellers must present their Australian Passport and Medicare card and request to be treated under the RHCA. The RHCA does not replace the need for travel insurance. For information regarding the RHCA, please go to www.medicareaustralia.gov.au. Please consult a medical practitioner for your specific risk to these preventable diseases and appropriate avoidance measures. Australians travelling to Norway should ensure that they have adequate travel insurance to cover the length of their stay. Medications that are legal in Australia may be illegal in other countries. Time Differences between Norway and Australia

Norway is Greenwich Mean Time +1 hour (+2 during daylight saving). The applicable time zone is Central European Time (CET) or Central European Summer Time (CEST). Daylight saving is observed from the last Sunday in March to the last Sunday in October.

Norway, 12 noon, Winter (Dec) = Perth 7pm; Darwin 8:30pm; Brisbane 9pm; Adelaide 9:30pm; Hobart, Melbourne, Sydney 10pm.
Norway, 12 noon, Summer (Jun) = Perth 6pm; Darwin, Adelaide 7:30pm; Brisbane, Hobart, Melbourne, Sydney 8pm.

Duty Free Allowances for Norway and Australia

Duty Free limits when entering Norway:

Alcohol: 1L of spirits and 1.5L of wine or 3L of beverages between 2.5% and 22% alc/vol plus an additional 2L of beverages between 2.5% and 4.7% alc/vol.
Tobacco: 200 leaves of cigarette paper and either 200 cigarettes or 250 g of tobacco
Total Tax Free Goods: Up to 6000 NOK inclusive of above

Duty Free limits when entering Australia:

Alcohol: 2.25 L.
Tobacco: 25 cigarettes plus one open packet of cigarettes.
Other Goods: Up to a value of \$900 (\$450 if under 18 years).

Please go to www.toll.no for further details on Norwegian Customs and Duty Free regulations. Minors may not claim alcohol or tobacco products. Further restrictions apply to these and other goods, travellers should familiarise themselves with these restrictions before entry.




Interbank Rate

1 Australian Dollar (AUD) = 6.02 Norwegian Kroner
 10 Norwegian Kroner (NOK) = 1.66 Australian Dollars

With 4% Margin

1 Australian Dollar (AUD) will buy 5.79 Norwegian Kroner
 10 Norwegian Kroner (NOK) will cost 1.73 Australian Dollars

All rates were correct at a point in time on Monday, 05 Nov 2018. The "Interbank Rate" does not take into account any exchange fees, while the "With 4% Margin" adds 4% to the exchange rate to simulate a typical margin that would be paid when exchanging currencies. These rates have been rounded and should not be used when calculating transactions of large value.

The following is a purchasing-power comparison of the Norwegian Kroner and the Australian Dollar, using the Big Mac as a common good. While it does not present a faultless comparison, it is a useful indicator of the purchasing power of each currency.

Big Mac Australia: \$5.95 (AUD) = 35.81 Kroner
 Big Mac Norway: 49 kr (NOK) = 8.14 Australian Dollars

A Big Mac in Norway is therefore 37% more expensive than in Australia.

This comparison is based on 2018 prices using current exchange rates. Prices may not include variations by locality or local taxes.

Notes and Coins of Norway

The legal currency of Norway is the Norwegian krone (plural kroner), which is abbreviated using either its currency code "NOK" or the symbols "kr" or ",-". The subunit of the krone is the øre, of which there are 100 in every krone. The following units of currency are the most common in Norway but other versions and denominations are also in circulation. Pictures are not to scale.

Full Name: Kongeriket Norge
(Kingdom of Norway).

Independence: 7 June 1905 (from Sweden).

Size: 304,282 km² (30% larger than Victoria).

Population: 4.7 million (20% of Australia).

Ethnicity: Norwegian 94.4% (incl. 60,000 Sami), other European 3.4%, other 2.2%.

Language: Bokmal Norwegian and Nynorsk Norwegian are official. Some Sami and Finnish speaking communities as well.

Religion: Church of Norway (Lutheran) 85.7%, other Christian 4.4%, Muslim 1.8%.

Significant Dates:

- 800-1050 AD - Viking Age. Erik the Red leads settlers to Greenland.
- 900 AD - Norway united as a Kingdom.
- 995 - King Olav converts to Christianity.
- 1350 - Black Death kills more than half of the population.
- 1397 - Kalmar Union of Denmark, Sweden and Norway.
- 1536 - Norway becomes a province of Denmark.
- 1814-1905 - Union with Sweden.
- 1905 - Norway gains independence.
- 1914 - Norway is neutral in WW1.
- 1940-45 - Neutral Norway is occupied by Germany during WW2.
- 1949 - Norway joins NATO.
- 1960's - Oil and gas discovered.
