The Netherlands forms part of the Schengen Area. Australian This advice is current for Mon, 5th November 2018. passport holders are usually allowed to enter the Schengen Area for Tourism or Business purposes for up to 90 days in any 180 day period without a visa. The countries which make up the Schengen Area are Austria, Belgium, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden and Switzerland.

Travellers to the Schengen Area are recommended to ensure their passport is valid for at least six months beyond their intended stay. Travellers are also recommended to be able to provide documentation confirming their ability to financially maintain themselves during their stay as well as tickets and entry documents for their onward destination. For further information and to confirm that you are able to travel to the Schengen Area without a visa, please contact a Dutch mission on the details below.

Vaccinations and Health Precautions

Prior to Travelling to The Netherlands Current DFAT Travel Advice

Exercise normal safety precautions in the Netherlands. Use common sense. Look out for suspicious behaviour, as you would in Australia. There remains a heightened threat of terrorist attack in a number of European countries, including the Netherlands. The Netherlands' national terrorism threat level is at 'substantial'. This is the fourth of five levels. See Safety and security.

There are new security measures at Amsterdam Schiphol Airport. Allow extra time for pre-departure and transfer formalities. See Safety and security. Robbery, pickpocketing and bag snatching are common, particularly around tourist attractions. See Safety and security.

Australians travelling to the Netherlands should ensure that they have adequate travel insurance to cover the length of their stay. Medications that are legal in Australia may be illegal in other countries. Under the Reciprocal Health Care Agreement, Australians visiting the Netherlands are entitled to free access to the public health care system. To take advantage of this, travellers must obtain a Certificate of Eligibility by forwarding a copy of their Australian Passport, Medicare card and an A111 application form to Zilveren Kruis Insurance (further details are located on the Human Services website listed below). This agreement does not replace the need for travellers to take out travel insurance to cover the length of their stay. All rates were correct at a point in time on Monday, 05 Nov 2018. The "Interbank Rate" does not take into account any exchange fees, while the "With 4% Margin" adds 4% to the exchange rate to simulate a typical margin that would be paid when exchanging currencies. These rates have been rounded and should not be used when calculating transactions of large value.

Information and Cheat Sheet Purchasing-Power Parity

The following is a purchasing-power comparison of the Euro in The Netherlands and the Australian Dollar, using the Big Mac as a common good. While it is not a faultless comparison, it is a useful indicator of the purchasing-power of the two currencies.

Big Mac Australia: 5.95 (AUD) = 3.76 Euro Big Mac The Netherlands: 3.71 (EUR) = 5.88 Australian Dollars

A Big Mac in The Netherlands is therefore 1% less expensive than in Australia.

This comparison is based on 2018 prices using current exchange rates. Prices may not include variations by locality or local taxes.
