Tourist Entry Requirements

Australian ordinary passport holders usually do not require a This advice is current for Mon, 5th November 2018. visa to enter the United Kingdom (UK) for a period of up to 180 days for tourist or business purposes, provided that they have not previously been refused entry to Britain and do not have a criminal record. Those wishing to stay longer than 180 days, intending to marry, study or seeking employment will be required to obtain a visa. For further information on applying for a visa, please see the VFS Global website on the details below. Passports are recommended to be valid for six months beyond the period of intended stay. Travellers should also be able to show documentation confirming their ability to financially maintain themselves during their stay, as well as tickets and entry documents for their next destination.

Additional conditions may apply to minors. Travellers are recommended to contact a UK representative on the details below for further information and to ensure that their specific circumstances make them eligible to enter the UK without a visa.

Current DFAT Travel Advice

Exercise normal safety precautions in the United Kingdom (UK). Use common sense. Look out for suspicious behaviour. Monitor the media and other sources for changes to local travel conditions.

Australians in the United Kingdom may be eligible to access subsidised health care as part of the Reciprocal Health Care Agreement (RHCA) between the two countries. To take advantage of this program, travellers should visit a doctor or outpatient section of a public hospital who are prepared to treat them as a National Health Service (NHS) patient. Australians must be able to present their Australian Passport and Medicare card, and advise medical staff that they wish to be treated under the RHCA. Australians travelling to the United Kingdom should ensure that they have adequate travel insurance to cover the length of their stay. The UK is Greenwich Mean Time +0 hours (+1 during daylight saving). The applicable time zones are Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) or British Summer Time (BST/BDT). Daylight saving is observed from the last weekend in March to the last weekend in October.

UK, 12 noon, Winter (Dec) = Perth 8pm, Darwin 9:30pm, Brisbane 10pm, Adelaide 10:30pm, Hobart, Melbourne, Sydney 11pm.

UK, 12 noon, Summer (Jun) = Perth 7pm, Darwin, Adelaide 8:30pm, Brisbane, Hobart, Melbourne, Sydney 9pm.

Duty Free Allowances

Allowances when entering the UK from a non EU state:

Alcohol: 1 L spirits (>22% alc vol) or 2 L other beverages;

as well as 4 L of still wine and 16 L of beer.

Tobacco: 200 cigarettes or 50 cigars or 250 g of tobacco.

Other Goods: Up to a value of £390.

Allowances when entering Australia:

Alcohol: 2.25 L.

Tobacco: 25 cigarettes plus one open packet of cigarettes. Other Goods: Up to a value of \$900 (\$450 if under 18 years).

Minors may not claim alcohol or tobacco products. Further restrictions apply when entering/exiting the UK and Australia. Travellers are encouraged to familiarise themselves with these restrictions before crossing the borders of either country. Electrical Adaptors and Voltage

Electrical socket: British (type G).

Supply: 230 V, 50 Hz (same as Australia).

A voltage converter is not usually required to use appliances designed for Australian use. A socket converter is generally all that is required for these appliances.

Information for The United Kingdom Driving in the United Kingdom

Persons who hold a full and valid Australian drivers licence who are visiting the United Kingdom are usually permitted to drive any small vehicle that is shown on their licence, such as cars and or motorcycles.

This only applies for a period of 12 months from the date of entering the United Kingdom.





Exchange Rate

Interbank Rate

\$1 Australian Dollar (AUD) = £0.55 British Pounds £1 British Pound (GBP) = \$1.81 Australian Dollars

With 4% Margin

\$1 Australian Dollar (AUD) will buy £0.53 British Pounds £1 British Pound (GBP) will cost \$1.88 Australian Dollars

All rates were correct at a point in time on Monday, 05 Nov 2018. The "Interbank Rate" does not take into account any exchange fees, while the "With 4% Margin" adds 4% to the exchange rate to simulate a typical margin that would be paid when exchanging these currencies. These currency rates have been rounded and should not be used when calculating transactions of large value.

Purchasing Power Parity

The following is a purchasing-power comparison of the British Pound and the Australian Dollar, using the Big Mac as a common good. While it does not present a faultless comparison, it is a useful indicator of the purchasing power of each currency.

Big Mac Australia: \$5.95 (AUD) = £3.29 British Pounds
Big Mac UK: £3.19 (GBP) = \$5.78 Australian Dollars

A Big Mac in the United Kingdom is therefore 3% less expensive than in Australia.

This comparison is based on 2018 prices using current exchange rates. Prices may not include variations by locality or local taxes.

Notes and Coins of the United Kingdom

The legal currency of the United Kingdom is the Pound Sterling (plural pounds), which is abbreviated using the symbol £. The subunit of the pound is the penny (plural pence or p), of which there are 100 in every pound. There are several forms of notes and coins in the United Kingdom, including those issued in crown dependencies, Scotland and Northern Ireland. The most common notes are those issued by the Bank of England, most of which appear below. Pictures are not to scale. As it is illegal in many countries to print copies of bank notes, travellers are advised to remove the below images prior to travelling.
